Women relied on themselves as the primary caregiver for their families and themselves. They also relied on their relationships with other women, including their mothers and friends, for strength and support. Disclosing their HIV status is a profound, complicated decision for women, whether they choose to disclose to everyone in their life, to some people or to no one. Secrecy and disclosure were major issues for all the women interviewed. Women have difficulty disclosing their HIV status to family members for fear of rejection and out of concern T 2 ABLE that they might burden their parents or children. Many have experienced discrimination within their families, in the workplace and Secrecy and Disclosure in accessing medical care.
